<u>Undergraduate Ceremony:</u> Friday, Dec. 16, 1:00 p.m.

Undergraduate Data Science students will walk with the College of Computing and Informatics. **Arrive 90 minutes prior to the ceremony start time** Line-up will take place in the practice gym. Graduating students must have a valid UNC Charlotte ID or a government-issued photo ID and their UNC Charlotte ID number to participate in commencement. Students should be wearing their full regalia to line-up.

Graduate Student Ceremony: Friday, Dec. 16, 6:00 p.m.

ALL graduate students attend the Graduate School Commencement on Friday, December 16th at 6:00 pm. Graduate students do NOT attend their individual college's ceremony. **Arrive 90 minutes prior to the ceremony start time.**Line-up will take place in the practice gym. 

Chancellor's and Dean's List

With grades for the fall 2022 semester posting on December 19th, here are some guidelines for achieving this goal.

- Chancellor's List requires a student to be a full-time student during the fall/spring semester, be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours, and obtain a grade point average of at least a 3.8 for that term in good academic standing.
- Dean's List recognizes students who have completed at least 12 credit hours for a fall/spring semester and have earned a grade point average of at least a 3.4 for the term in good academic standing.
- Share the list with family and friends through the **Niner Central page** that lists all students who are on Chancellor's or Dean's list each term.

DegreeWorks Audit: On Track to Graduate?

DegreeWorks is a web-based planning tool that accurately displays required coursework and helps students monitor their progress toward graduation. Students can access their real-time audit in DegreeWorks via my.charlotte.edu and should routinely check their progress toward degree completion.

For any required courses that are in the "Fall Through" or "Not Counted" sections of DegreeWorks, submit an Academic Petition that requests the courses be counted towards your program requirements.




